

Last fall, Scott Township had the opportunity to host two professionals from Burma/Myanmar and Vietnam as participants in the Professional Fellows Program, sponsored by the US Department of State and arranged by the ICMA.

First, I want to thank you for affording me the pleasure and opportunity to be your commissioner in the Second Ward. I have some very exciting news about needed improvements that have or will take place this year in our ward.

The sewer line behind 6 houses on Claireview has now been officially accepted by the township. The sanitary sewer line has been a severe problem for six home owners since the homes were built in 1958. The original developer installed the main sanitary sewer in the street incorrectly placing it higher than the basement floors on these homes. The developer then placed a 4 inch line behind the homes in an attempt to rectify the problem and did not install any clean outs on this sewer line. This past summer with engineering services donated from Mark Mox two new manholes were installed by the township enabling the township the ability to clean and maintain this sewer line. Mr. Mox also created the necessary easement drawings on this sewer line so it could be properly accepted by the township. Prior to these improvements the township could not perform maintenance on this line and the home owners were forced to deal with numerous unsanitary sewage backups. Thank you Mr. Mox!

The next large project completed in Ward 2 was modifying the storm water management plan behind the homes on Pinetrees Drive off of Lindsay Road. Since the property was developed in 2002, horrific flooding of homes and the street would occur during large rain events. Large swales and storm management facilities were reinstalled correctly by the township to prevent future flooding.

This year we will finally have new playground equipment installed with one half of the financing secured through a DCNR matching grant at the Lindsay Road Scott Park, further the new pool facility being constructed is on schedule to open Memorial Day weekend with absolutely no cost increase in pool passes or daily admissions.

This year the commissioners are exploring moving monetary funds in the budget into our yearly road paving budget so that more roads can be repaired and repaved. We are also exploring alternative paving methods suggested by Commissioner Calabria that will be more cost effective. I have also had far fewer complaints of cars parking in the front yards, and I thank you for your civic pride.

I have also been asked by the Wynnecliffe Manor Virginia Vue Civic League to inform residents of Ward 2 that Santa and the horse drawn sleigh has been scheduled for December 10, 2016 starting at Crosswinds at approximately 9:00 am and finishing up in the late afternoon at Pinetrees.

I hope you have a great year, and again thank you for your trust, and please be assured that every attempt is being made to not waste your tax dollars. My father always would ask me when I wanted to purchase things "is that something you need or just something you just want" and I always ask myself the same thing before I vote on matters involving finance.

The Scott Township Police Department consists of 21 full time sworn officers and answers an average of 5,000 complaints a year and about 450 arrests. The Department has 2 bicycle Officers, 1 full time Investigator, 1 K-9 Team and a School Resource Officer assigned to the CV Intermediate Unit. The Department is also ctive with several Joint Task Forces, including The District Attorneys Narcotic Enforcement Team, The South Hills DUI Task Force and the SHACOG Critical Incident Response Team.

SERVICES

Fingerprinting- Available to residents and employees of businesses located in Scott. Appointments are scheduled between 3pm and 5pm Sunday - Thursday. There is a \$10 fee. Call Officer Burek to schedule an appointment @ 412 276-7725 ext 281.

Incident Reports – If you are involved in an incident and need a copy of the report, contact Franny Morelli @ 412 276-7725 ext 235. The report will be released if the incident is closed. If you want to file a report for an incident, call 9-1-1. An officer can come to your residence in Scott or you can go to the Police Station to make the report. We do not take reports over the phone.

Identity Theft Presentations – Officers provide talks to groups to give information on ways to protect themselves from becoming a victim. Contact Sgt Skees @ 412.276-7725 ext 248.

K-9 Demonstrations. We provide demonstrations on how Police K-9's assist us in our duties to groups of 20 or more. Contact Officer McGrath @ 412.276.7725 ext 241.

Suspicious Activity: We need your help in watching for any suspicious activities in your neighborhood. When something doesn't seem right, call the police, we will investigate. Call 9-1-1, if it needs immediate attention. For general information or comments, call 412-276-7725 and leave a message.

Abandon Vehicles: The Police Department investigates abandon vehicles on public streets with either an expired inspection sticker or registration plate. Vehicles that are parked on private property are investigated by the Ordinance Officer, Bob Fischer. He can be contacted @ 412.276.5300 ext 252.

On Street Parking: Some areas have restricted parking from 2am - 6am. Vehicles must be completely off the road to be in compliance. In a temporary situation where a vehicle needs to be parked on the street, call the non emergency dispatch or the Police Department number between 8am and 4pm Monday thru Friday.

Door to Door Solicitation: Scott Township has a Solicitation Ordinance that requires individuals to obtain a permit before soliciting. Application can be made at the Police Station. Soliciting is not permitted past dusk or after noon on Saturday. No soliciting on Sunday and Holidays.

Vacation Checks: Call 412-276-7725 or email <u>police@scotttownship.com</u>. Provide your name, address, contact phone number, dates you will be gone and information pertinent to the property (i.e. lights on timers, cars in driveway, etc.) and a local emergency contact name and number should a problem arise.

What is Stormwater Management?

Stormwater management is the control of water that runs off the surface of land from rain and/or the melting of ice or snow. Construction of impervious surfaces, such as roofs, roadways and parking lots allow uncontrolled water to directly flow to catch basins that collect, convey and discharge runoff into our streams and waterways, minimizing natural infiltration into the soil.

What You Can Do To Help with Stormwater Management

Anything that goes into our storm inlets flow untreated to the Township's streams and waterways. Here's a list of some simple tips and things you can do to help keep our waters clean and safe now and in the future.

- Dispose of household hazardous waste such as paints, used auto fluids such as antifreeze, oil, etc. and batteries at designated collection recycling locations... "Do Not Dump, Drains to Stream" are drain markers you see that are installed on many of our catch basins.
- Clean up after your pet and properly dispose of pet waste.
- Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly. If you do use them, select brands that are labeled or marked safe for the environment.
- · Repair leaks from automobiles and other motorized equipment.
- Use a commercial car wash, or wash your car with biodegradable soap on a lawn or other unpaved surfaces.
- Do not spray or wash pavement debris and yard clippings out onto the street.
- Participate in our leaf and branch waste program when possible.
- Clean paint brushes in a sink, not outdoors.
- Please don't litter. Always dispose of trash and other debris in an appropriate receptacle.

Everyone needs to do their part to help maintain a healthy and safe living environment. Every little bit helps!

e-wasie Recycling

In 2010, the PA state legislature banned many electronic devices, including televisions and computers from landfills and incinerators. Seoff Township - Carbage & Recycling Fiels-Up

1. REGULAR CURBSIDE COLLECTION: Garbage and refuse should be placed at the curb the night before your scheduled pick-up.

2. GUIDELINES FOR COLLECTION:

- Garbage should be in properly secured containers or plastic bags.
- All furniture items, appliances, household goods and disassembled children's swing sets will be accepted at curbside.
- Carpet should be rolled and tied in lengths not to exceed 48 inches so that one man can lift.
- Empty paint cans and/or dried paint is acceptable.
 Paint can be dried by air drying or soaking up with newspaper or kitty litter. Lids should be left off.

3. EXCLUDED ITEMS:

- Building materials may be picked up for a fee by calling Waste Management at 1-800-866-4460
- Tires
- Automobile parts, including wheel rims.
- · Trees and branches.
- · Ashes from furnaces and fireplaces.
- · Stones and dirt, liquid paint.

4. RECYCLING

Recyclables should be placed loose in a single container.

SINGLE STREAM RECYCLE: Residents do not have to separate the plastics—Type 1 through 7, metals, glass and papers.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS INCLUDE:

- Metal: Metal food cans, aerosol cans (empty), aluminum foil and foil products (clean), beer and soft drink cans
- Plastic: Pfastic baby wipe containers, bleach, detergent, household cleaner bottles, yogurt cups, food containers, margarine tubs, shampoo bottles
- Glass: Beverage bottles and food jars (clear, brown, amber and green)
- Paper: Paperboard boxes (cereal, tissue, shoes etc.), white office paper, computer paper, magazines, newspapers, advertising inserts, junk mail (including envelopes), catalogs, phone books, paperback books, coupons and receipts, paper bags and shopping bags (handles removed), corrugated, note: corrugated must be tied or bundled no longer than 14" x 14".

Recyclables will be picked up every other week on your regular garbage pick-up day. The municipality will be divided into two sections, (A) and (B). Please refer to the street listing (visit www.scott-twp.com) to be sure when service will be provided and refer to the calendar below.

5. HOLIDAY SERVICE: If a holiday falls on Monday, pickup will be one day later, Tuesday. Observed holidays for 2015 are: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas Day. If the holiday should fall on a weekend, your pickup day will not be affected.

6. APPLIANCES CONTAINING REFRIGERANT:

The contractor will collect such items as refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, water coolers, etc.; however, the item must have a sticker certifying that refrigerant has been removed. If it does not have the sticker, it will not be picked up because it is unlawful for the contractor to dispose of these items containing refrigerant. To save refrigerant removal costs, it is suggested that residents have the company delivering the new appliance dispose of the old appliance.

7. QUESTIONS REGARDING REFUSE OR RECYCLING COLLECTION AND BILLING CALL: Waste Management of PA at 800-866-4460.

Please look for your street name on either Schedule A or Schedule B for your recycling pickup date.

Regular Curbside Collection: Garbage and refuse should be placed at the curb after 6 p.m. on Sunday and before 6 a.m. on Monday for collection.

Lisa M. Riley, Tax Collector

The Scott Township Commissioners and School Board set the millage rates yearly when they adopt their budgets. The Allegheny County Board of Assessors determines the assessment of each property. The township or school district tax is calculated by multiplying the appropriate millage by the full market value as determined by the Allegheny County Office of Property Assessment.

On July 1st of each year the Scott Township Tax Office mails the township and school district real estate tax bills to either the property owner, their mortgage company, or their designated agent. Every property owner whose real estate taxes are paid by August 31st receives a 2% discount. The face tax is due no later than October 31st, and a 10% penalty is added to any unpaid tax on November 1st.

PLEASE NOTE: TO AVOID A PENALTY, ALL PAYMENTS MUST BE POSTMARKED BY DUE DATE OR PRIOR TO DUE DATE, NO EXCEPTIONS.

Chartiers Valley School District also offers an installment plan as an option to paying the tax in one payment. In order to pay the school tax in installments, the property owner must pay by the following dates below in 4 equal payments at face.

Installment Due Dates

- 1st payment October 15, 2016
- 2nd payment December 15, 2016
- 3rd payment February 15, 2017
 - 4th payment April 15, 2017

The Tax Office regularly updates the real estate tax records using deed transfers and information supplied by property owners or their agents. Allegheny County provides change orders used to update a property's assessment.

Delinquent Taxes

Homeowners whose taxes are delinquent will be subject to interest and lien fees and may be subject to a civil complaint filed with the District Magistrate.

Tax Office Hours

Hours are Monday through Friday 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. For your convenience, payments can be made at our drive-thru window. On evenings and weekends, a drop off box is located to the left of the drive-thru window.

Code Inforcement

When you are spring cleaning, keep in mind that it is unlawful to have unsightly debris or junk in your yard. It is also illegal to have unregistered or uninspected vehicles on your property.

Haul away bags or dumpsters can be placed on your property for clean up or a construction project for a maximum of **10 days**.

PODS are a convenient way to pack your belongings for storage elsewhere. Again, they can be on your property for a maximum of **10 days**. You **cannot** use trailers for storage on your property.



Parking on your lawn or in your yard is illegal and the Police Department and Code Enforcement are working together to step up enforcement. Officers will be looking for illegally parked cars evenings and week-ends and furnishing the information to the Code Enforcement Office.

Chicken coops are becoming increasingly popular, but township ordinances prohibit keeping poultry or farm animals, so raising chickens is not permitted in Scott Township.

Rental Properties

Under PA Act 21, effective June 1, 2015 owners of all rental properties will be required to install carbon monoxide detectors. This will become part of the inspection process.

Recycling

Effective April 1, 2015, Scott Township has gone to Automated Recycling.

Please place your recyclables in your new bin with the lid opening toward the street with a minimum of three feet



between each container and other objects. Do not park your vehicle near the container.

The truck has a mechanical arm that reaches the bin so it is very important that you follow the placement instructions.
