GARBAGE & RECYCLING PICK-UP

Garbage and Curbside Collection

Garbage and refuse will be collected every week on Monday. Garbage and refuse should be placed at the curb after 5 p.m. on Sunday and before 6 a.m. on Monday.

Guidelines for collection

- Garbage should be in properly secured containers or plastic bags.
- Grass clippings and weeds should be in plastic bags.
- Hedge cuttings, limbs and branches should be securely tied and should not exceed 48 inches in length.
- Branches should not exceed 3 inches in diameter.
- All furniture items, appliances, household goods and disassembled children's swing sets will be accepted at curbside.
- Carpet should be rolled and tied in lengths not to exceed 48 inches so that one man can lift.
- Empty paint cans and/or dried paint is acceptable. Paint can be dried by air drying or soaking up with newspaper or kitty litter. Lids should be left off.
- **One large household item** can be placed at the curb per week. If you have additional items, call Allied Waste to make arrangements for pick-up.

Excluded items:

- Auto parts, including wheel rims and tires.
- Trees and branches over 3 inches in diameter & longer than 4 ft.
- Ashes from furnaces and fireplaces. Stones and dirt, Liquid paint
- Leaves (municipality provides compost pick-up)
- Building materials (may be picked up for a fee by calling Allied Waste @ 412 429-2600)

- **Excluded items:** Televisions, desktop and laptop computers, monitors, printers, scanners, fax machines and CFL light bulbs.

Recycling Curbside Collection

Place all recyclable materials in one container... no separating or sorting needed. Glass, bottles, jars, metal beverage and food cans, Plastics #1 through #7, Plastic bottles with narrow necks, Paper from news, magazines, junk mail, dry non-coated food paper, Boxboard, small flat pieces of corrugated cardboard box material. All your recyclables go inside your Recycling Container.

Holiday Service Trash and Recycling

Only Memorial Day and Labor Day are affected in 2014.

Appliances Containing Refrigerant

The contractor will collect such items as refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, etc.; however, the item must have a sticker certifying that refrigerant has been removed. It is suggested that residents have the company delivering a new appliance dispose of the old appliance.

Ordinance No. 915 stipulates that garbage cannot be put out to the curb before 5 p.m. on Sunday and cans and bins must be removed and stored in back or side yard by Monday evening. Any violation of this ordinance is subject to a fine up to \$600.00.

We are mandated by Act 101 to remind our residents about the requirements of our recycling programs every six months.

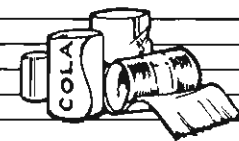
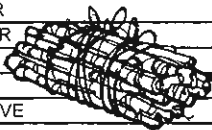

PARK RESERVATIONS

Park Reservations go on sale the first Monday in November each year. Residents rush to reserve the park facility they want for graduation parties, bridal showers, family reunions and picnics. Reservations for personal events can be made at the Administrative Offices, 2nd Floor of the Municipal Building beginning at 8:00 a.m. on November 3. You must be a resident of Scott Township, have your driver's license and all fees must be paid in full by cash or check.

Reservations for businesses located in Scott Township can be made January 5, 2015.

The shelters accommodate from 40 to 240 people and the indoor facilities hold approximately 70 to 100 people seated and are equipped with a kitchen.

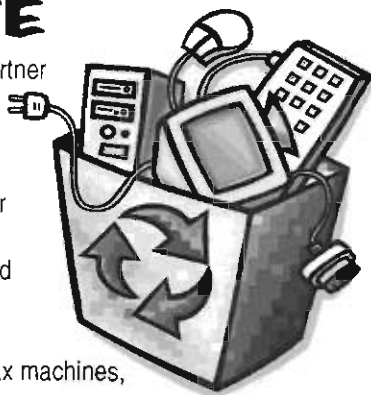

Our Public Works Department is already gearing up for the winter season. There are ways you can help them do a more efficient job and keep the roadways safe.

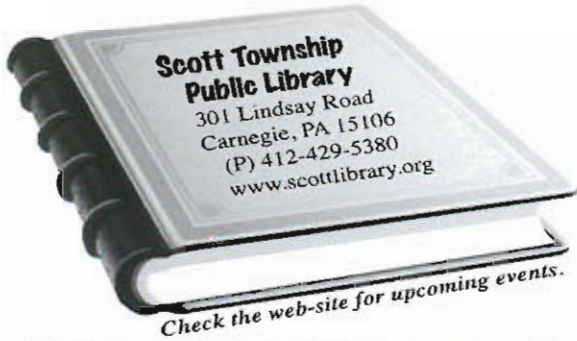
- ❖ Keep parked cars off the street during snowfalls. Snow removal crews need to be able to remove snow from the entire roadway.
- ❖ Be patient during a heavy snowfall. The Snow Removal Plan prioritizes major roads and streets and hazardous intersections. The crews will clear your street as quickly as possible.
- ❖ If you notice a hazardous section of Township road, report it to the Police Department or to Township Offices.

Ordinance 1486-01 prohibits shoveling or placing snow out onto public streets to protect the health, safety and welfare of others.
