Walsh advised that she is the owner of Nobby's Pizzeria and they have run the concession stand at Scott Pool for several years. Walsh expressed her concerns with the new rules of the pool and the recreation program as it is causing a negative impact on her business. The lunches provided to the recreation program are being delivered now so that eliminates the kids coming through the shop and possibly purchasing more items and with the elimination of certain Communities they have noticed a decrease in the customer totals. Walsh asked the Commissioners for a reduction in their rent if other arrangements cannot be met.

Castello said that he would agree with a reduction in the rent, and he apologized for not even considering the impact it would have on them.

Altman mentioned that the changes put in place that night are temporary until the other Communities are able to get their pools open and properly staffed.

Calabria asked Walsh how she pays for the rent. If it is a set fee or if it is based off revenues.

Walsh stated that it is a set fee.

Calabria suggested waiving their rental fee for the year.

Wells suggested making the rent a percentage of the revenues made.

Altman stated that the Board of Commissioners will discuss this issue during next month's meeting and vote on a resolution for them.

Wells stated that their season is only three months long.

Altman stated that it can be retroactive. She stated that she feels the board should take their time to discuss this issue and come up with a good resolution.

Shalomon asked for an update on the new system.

Fitzgerald stated that it is a very large project, and the Township is working on getting everything installed.

Shalomon enquired in regard to COVID Grants. He stated that there is funding and asked if the Township has submitted any applications for this.

Fitzgerald stated that the Townships allegations is going to be around \$1,700,000.00 and the Township has already applied for the Grant. There will have to be discussions with Counsel as to what these funds will be used for. Fitzgerald suggest the funds be used for infrastructure.

Shalomon asked how many Public Works employees the Township currently has.

Altman replied, 16.

Shalomon asked how many Summer Help personnel is being hired.

Fitzgerald stated that one individual was hired tonight and the OVR program has provided 8 additional individuals.

Shalamon asked if they are being used to help the Public Works Department.

Fitzgerald replied, yes.

Shalamon asked who their supervisor is.

Fitzgerald advised that the OVR program provides their own supervisors for these individuals.

Shalamon wanted confirmation that the Public Works employees are not provided supervision for these individuals.

Fitzgerald said the reason for the OVR program is so that you can train these individuals for their future. There are some Public Works employees who would teach these individuals somethings for example how to start a lawnmower or weedwhacker, but their direct supervisor is provided through the OVR Program.

Shalamon asked if they have been a help to the department or a hinder.

Fitzgerald replied, help.

McNeil said that he is glad the Township got one application for the summer help program. He was employed under the summer help program 11 years ago and he really enjoyed it and he learned a lot from the program. He suggested the Township look at possibly revamping the program to make it more interesting to attract more candidates.

Altman agreed and stated that Counsel has previously mentioned that they will be revisiting the program guidelines and possibly making changes to attract more help.

Commissioners Requests

Calabria stated that he had a constituent inquire about the Comcast telephone pole that has grown into the Townships sewer line. He stated that the company is telling the residents that they will be tearing into their yards to access the pipe.

Kelley stated that he will investigate this and get back to the Commissioners.

Calabria also mentioned that individuals went to Spinnerfield and the police came and asked them to leave because they did not have a permit.

Altman stated that there were issues in the past with basketball clinics, so if it was a larger group that may be what happened.

Chief asked for Calabria to get him the date of the incident and he would research what the situation was.

Calabria also mentioned a letter that he wrote regarding the traffic signal at North Wren.

Fitzgerald stated that she did not have time to review it with it being a meeting day, but she understands that Calabria would like to meet with Mudry.

Calabria said that he would have liked to meet with Mudry prior to the letter being sent out to Mt. Lebanon. He stated that Mudry's letter is very accurate, and Calabria doesn't have a problem with it, however he would have liked the opportunity to add information for example, there was never a right turn on red from North Wren. There is a wall there and the sight distance would be an issue.

Fitzgerald stated that the wall was built in a different place than where the design specified, they did ask if the Township would require them to move the wall.

Calabria stated that the wall doesn't need to be moved, he just wouldn't make a right turn on red.

Fitzgerald said that she can have the traffic engineer look into this and address.

Gazda wished everyone a happy and safe holiday.

Sedlak said the same.

Seibel agreed.

Meyers mentioned that Washington Road has been closed 4 times due to rain and she suggests the Township push the State to assist with the problem since the road is a state road.

Altman said that everyone agrees.

Castello stated that he reached out to Anita Kulik and he is still awaiting a response at this time. They are going to be setting up a meeting with Castello, Meyers, Kelley, Anita, and Penndot to discuss the flooding issues. He also addressed an issue with Virginia Mansions getting flooded, he will get with Kelley to discuss this issue.

Wells asked if there was going to be attention given to the municipal building and the Township fields. He stated that they all look messy.

Fitzgerald said that this is something the OVR Program will be focusing on.
