The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Buffalo District is pleased to announce the release of the remedial investigation report and the proposed plan for the Superior Steel Site, for public comment. The 37-acre industrial property is located at 500 Superior Street, in Scott Township, Pennsylvania. The report and proposed plan are available on the project website at: <https://www.lrb.usace.army.mil/Missions/HTRW/FUSRAP/Superior-Steel-Site/> in the Reports Section.

The Superior Steel Site is a Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program site. Under this program, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers identifies, investigates and, if necessary, cleans up sites throughout the United States, that were used as part of the nation's early atomic weapons and energy program. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers follows the phased investigation process required in the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act, as amended, and the National Oil and Hazardous Substances Pollution Contingency Plan, when implementing Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers concludes, based on the remedial investigation findings, that cleanup is not necessary, and no further action is required at the Superior Steel Site. The baseline human health risk assessment shows that there is no unacceptable risk to receptors from uranium under current or reasonably anticipated future land uses. Also, the ecological risk assessment shows that there are not likely to be any adverse ecological impacts from uranium. Under the proposed plan of no further action, no remedial action would be performed, and no institutional controls would be implemented.

The no action remedy outlined in the proposed plan may be modified based on any new information acquired during the designated public comment period. Once the public comment period for the proposed plan closes, a record of decision will be issued outlining the selected remedy. The record of decision will include a written response to comments received on the proposed plan and is currently scheduled for release in 2025.

The proposed plan and supporting documents are available in the administrative record file for the site, which is located on the project website listed above. It is also available for viewing electronically online in the Scott Township Public Library, 301 Lindsay Road, Carnegie, Pennsylvania. The administrative record file is also available for review by appointment at the Buffalo District Office Library located at 1776 Niagara Street, Buffalo, New York.

You are encouraged to review and provide comments on the proposed plan. The public comment period for the proposed plan begins May 8, 2023, and ends July 7, 2023. A public meeting will be conducted at the Scott Township Municipal Building, Main Meeting Room, located at 301 Lindsay Rd, Carnegie, Pennsylvania 15106, on Wednesday, May 24, 2023, beginning at 6:30 p.m. A court recorder will be available to record verbal comments during the meeting and after the presentation.
