Cochran Road Development Receives Final Approval for Mixed Use Building

The Board of Commissioners approved a Final Major Development application filed by Manor Oak One Associates who are planning to construct a new, mixed-used building at 1910 Cochran Road. The vacant Max & Erma's Restaurant building will be demolished to make way for the new structure.

The developers are in talks with a few different entities to fill out the space. It is expected that two eateries and a medical office will open in the new space.

Pool Concession Awarded for 2024 Season

S & C Services, Inc. were awarded a one year contract to provide concessions this summer at the Township Pool. Based in McKees Rock, S & C Services, Inc. has been in business for nearly 20 years providing general and skilled labor, remodeling, commercial cleaning and home improvement.

The menu for this season includes all the usuals including hotdogs, nachos, French fries, chicken tenders, pizza, drinks, snacks and frozen treats. The Township will collect 10% of the proceeds.

Emergency Service Personnel Honored

The Township had the privilege of being able to honor some of its emergency service personnel by presenting proclamations for taking life saving actions in recent weeks.

Glendale Hose Co. #1 firefighter, Hannah Salerno, was presented a proclamation for her life saving actions at a Chartiers Valley spring musical when she performed the Heimlich maneuver on a young student who was choking unable to breath. Hannah's calm, quick and decisive actions saved the young mans life.

Scott Township EMS Chief Scott Cavey, Paramedics Supervisor Susan King, Paramedic Dominic Lazaro, EMT Matthew Popichak, Advanced EMT Supervisor Amanda Payne, and Glendale Hose Company #1 Members; Captain Daniel LaGamba, and Engineer Benjamin McBride immediately jumped into action when a resident stopped at the station when her husband was having a heart attack. The team worked quickly to provide life saving aid to the gentlemen who is now on his way to recovery. The Township is lucky to have such amazing emergency service personnel.

ALCOSAN Regionalization Moves Forward

As part of ALCOSAN's regionalization plan municipalities are required to fix known defects in their sewer lines prior to ALCOSAN taking ownership of those lines. The Township has four remaining sanitary sewer lines remaining to be corrected prior to transferring the lines to ALCOSAN. This includes lines at Whiskey Run (C-30), Hope Hollow (C-48), Scrubgrass Run (C-49), and Painters Run (C-53).

ALCOSAN offers the opportunity to municipalities to submit an opinion of probable cost of the work to correct the remaining defects. Once ALCOSAN agrees to the opinion of probable cost, the municipality will pay this cost to ALCOSAN who then assumes responsibility for the repairs of the defects, relieving the Township of that obligation.

The Township's Engineers estimated a probable cost of \$214,000.00 to repair the remaining defects. By paying this amount to ALCOSAN, it provides the Township protection against rising costs or potential project issues involved with the necessary repair work.

Glendale Hose Company No. 1 Receives Partial Allotment of Funding; Food Truck Tuesdays Return

The Board of Commissioners approved Glendale Hose Company No. 1's request for their partial allotment of annual funding. The volunteer fire department is set to receive \$66,500.00 of their annual funding allotment. They will use this funding for the annual payment on Engine #257 of their fleet.

Glendale Hose Company also has dinner covered for you every Tuesday night from now through September 17th with their weekly food truck from 4:30pm to 7:00pm at their station located at 541 Carothers Avenue featuring several rotating vendors.

Township and Union Agree to MOA Allowing for Early Retirements

A Memorandum of Agreement was agreed upon by the Township and Teamsters Local 249, the union responsible for representing the public works and clerical union, to allow for the option of early retirement for qualifying employees. The Agreement will open a window from now until the end of the year for employees who have had at least 10 years of service to the Township and has reached the age of 62.

Employees electing the early retirement option will receive continued health, dental and vision insurance until the retiree is Medicare-eligible or has been retired for 5 years. Retiring employees will also receive payment for accumulated unused sick leave, up to 120 days.

This Agreement also allows for the Township to now contract out certain collection duties for real estate tax, earned income tax, Act 511 taxes and any other tax or levy imposed by the Township. Anticipating at least two retirements from the clerical union, the Township estimates a savings of approximately \$200,000.00 annually on wage and benefits.

Splash Pad Opened! Ribbon Cutting Rescheduled

The Township welcomed residents to the Park to celebrate the official opening of the Pool's newest attraction. After several delays resulting from procurement and construction issues, the Township unveiled the long awaited Splash Pad. Residents enjoyed this first opportunity to see the newly installed Splash Pad up close while enjoying the first weekend of the Summer.

Kids and their parents played and splashed all weekend in the many features of the splash pad as well as taking advantage of the freshly installed sod to lay out and enjoy the sun.

Residents and Patrons were also now able to take advantage of the new chair lift at Community Room Pool Building and newly constructed restrooms located at pool level.

A ribbon cutting ceremony for the opening of the Pickle Ball courts has been postponed until June 6th at 6:00pm. Unfortunately the final fencing items were unable to be delivered and installed as expected.

Scott Township PD Seeks to Establish an Eligibility List

Scott Township Police Department are set advertise for the testing of candidates to establish an eligibility list for Police Officers that the Township may hire from in the event the Township should need to hire another officer. The most recent eligibility list of the Township expired at the beginning of this month. Those interested should please contact the Scott Township Police Department for details.

In other department updates, the Township has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Allegheny County District Attorneys Office to process public requests for audio and video police recordings. This MOU formalizes the process required by Act 22 of 2017.

The Board of Commissioners also approved a new contract with the Chartiers Valley School District for the assignment of a School Resource Officer at the Intermediate School.

Board of Commissioners Votes Down Chicken Ordinance

The Board of Commissioners voted down Ordinance No. 1694-24 by a 5-3 vote at this month's regular meeting. The Ordinance would have authorized the keeping of chickens subject to a number of criteria and regulations. The vote came after several discussions and a public meeting over the course of the preceding months.

Currently the Township Zoning Ordinance prohibits the keeping of chickens and other fowl.

Summer Recreation Program Replacement

Despite temporarily halting the Township's annual recreation program to focus on providing a better program and experience, the Township will offer an alternative option this Summer. The Board of Commissioners approved Amazing Athletes to run week long themed recreation camps in the Park this June and July. This approval is subject to the Township receiving all appropriate documentation and insurance.

Amazing Athletes offers two age groups, 4-6 years old and 7-9 years old. Each camp will run Monday through Thursday from 9:30am to 12:00pm, with Friday being a make up date. Each week has a different theme and activities for the kids to engage in including sharks and mermaids, sports, animal adventures, Olympics, obstacle course, and carnival themes.
